V. And be it further enacted, That if within two Months from the Date of his Majesty's Warrant for embodying any Regiment, Battalion, or Corps of Militia in Great Britain, a sufficient Number of Officers possessing the Qualification required by Law within the County, Riding, Shire, Stewartry, or Place, to which such Regiment, Battalion, or Corps shall belong, cannot be found to accept Commissions therein, it shall be lawful for the Lieutenants and Deputy Lieutenants respectively, with the Approbation of his Majesty, to appoint Persons possessing any sufficient Estate or Property of the Value required by Law, in any other Part of England or Wales, if such Regiment, Battalion, or Corps, shall be Part of the Militia of England, or in any other Part of Scotland, if such Regiment, Battalion, or Corps, shall be Part of the Militia of Scotland.

CAP. XXXIX.

An Act for appointing Commissioners for distributing the Money stipulated to be paid by the United States of America, under the Convention made between his Majesty and the said United States, among the Persons having Claims to Compensation out of such Money.

[22d April 1803.]

WHEREAS by a Convention, made at London on the eighth Day of January One thousand eight hundred and two, between his Mainly and the Harington and the Haring hundred and two, between his Majesty and the United States of America, the said United States engaged to pay, and his Majesty consented to accept, for the Use of the Persons described in the sixth Article of the Treaty of Commerce, Amity, and Navigation, concluded at London on the fourth Day of November One thousand seven hundred and ninety-four, between his Majesty and the said United States, in Satisfaction and Discharge of the Money which the United States might have been liable to pay, in pursuance of the Provisions of the said sixth Article, the Sum of six hundred thousand Pounds Sterling, payable at the City of Washington in America, in three annual Instalments of two hundred thousand Pounds Sterling each, and to fuch Person or Persons as should be authorized by his Majesty to receive the same; the first of the said Instal-ments to be paid at the Expiration of one Year, and the second Instalment at the Expiration of two Years. and the third and last Instalment at the Expiration of three Years next following the Exchange of the Ratisication of the said Convention, and to be paid in Money of the said United States, reckoning four Dollars and forty-four Cents to be equal to one Pound Sterling: And whereas it is expedient that Commissioners found be appointed for the apportioning, dividing, and distributing such Sum of Money amongst the several Persons who shall by such Commissioners be found entitled to receive Compensation out of the same, in Proportion to their several and respective Claims, so far as the same shall by such Commissioners be approved or adjudged to be good: May it therefore please your Mainstrate that it may be enacted, and be it enacted by the adjudged to be good: May it therefore please your Majesty that it may be enacted, and be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That Thomas Macdonald Esquire, Henry Pye Rich Esquire, and John Guillemard Esquire, shall be, and they are hereby constituted and appointed Commissioners for the Purposes aforesaid; and that the Adjudication of such Commissioners, or any two of them, as to all Claims made for Compensation out of such Money, and also as to the Apportionment and Distribution thereof as aforesaid, shall be final and conclusive.

II. And be it further enacted, That the faid Commissioners in this Act named, before they enter upon the Their Oath. Execution of the same, shall take an Oath before the Master of the Rolls for the Time being, or one of his Majefty's Juffices of the Court of King's Bench, Common Pleas, or Barons of the Exchequer (which they, or either of them, are hereby authorized and required to administer in the Form following, that is to say),

VII. And be it further enacted, That no Claim or Request of any Person or Persons under this Act shall

be received after the first Day of June One thousand eight hundred and four.

VIII. And be it further enacted, That the said Commissioners shall from Time to Time, at their Discretion, or as often as they shall be thereunto required, and as soon as possible for the Determination of their Examinations and Proceedings, by virtue of this Act, without any further Requisition, give an Account of their Proceedings in Writing to the Lords Commissioners of his Majesty's Treasury, and to his Majesty's Prin-

cipal Secretaries of State for the Time being.

IX. And be it further enacted, That the Lords Commissioners of the Treasury, or Lord High Treasurer for the Time being, are hereby authorized to iffue, or caufe to be iffued, all fuch Sums of Money as may from Time to Time be necessary for the enabling the said Commissioners to carry into Execution the Purposes of this Act, and shall cause the same to be paid to such Person or Persons as the said Commissioners, or any two of them, shall, by Writing under their Hands, desire or direct out of any Part of the publick Monies remaining in his Majesty's Exchequer; which Sum so issued and paid shall be employed for the Payment of fuch Secretary, Agents, Clerks, Messengers, and other Officers, and in defraying all other necessary Charges in or about the Execution of the Powers of this Act, and in such Manner and in such Proportions as shall be appointed by the faid Commissioners, or any two of them, by Writing under their Hands and Seals in that Behalf, the fame to be accounted for by the Person or Persons to whom the same shall be issued and paid, according to the Course of his Majesty's Exchequer, without any Fee or other Charges to be taken or demanded for the Issuing and Payment of the same, or on the Passing of the said Accounts, other than such Sum as the faid Commissioners, or any two of them, shall appoint; and which Money so issued shall not be subject to any Tax, Duty, Rate, or Affessment whatsoever imposed by Authority of Parliament.

" His Majesty may supply Vacancies occasioned by Death or Resignation of Commissioners during the Recess " of Parliament, § 10.

XI. And be it further enacted, That the faid feveral Instalments of the faid Sum of fix hundred thousand Pounds shall, as soon after the Payment thereof respectively in America as the same can be done, be remitted to and paid into the Hands of the Cashier of the Governor and Company of the Bank of England, to the Account of, and with the Privity and in the Names of, the Commissioners appointed under this Act, and shall be and remain in the Names of the faid Commissioners for the Time being under this Act, to be paid to the several and respective Persons entitled thereto, under the Orders of the said Commissioners, or any two of them,

pursuant to the Provisions of this Act.

XII. And be it further enacted, That when and fo foon as the faid Commissioners, or any two of them, shall have approved and adjudged the Claim of any Person or Persons to any such Compensation as aforesaid, to be good and valid in the Whole or in Part, and ascertained the Amount of any Dividend or Proportion of Money to which any such Person is or Persons respectively are then entitled, the said Commissioners, or any two of them, shall make out, or cause to be made out, in such Form as they shall think sit, an Order or Orders for the Payment of such Sum or Sums respectively as shall have been so ascertained as aforesaid, or of such Part thereof as shall be in Proportion to the Amount of the Money which shall then have been remitted from America, and paid into the Bank of England, in Manner hereinbefore directed, and shall annex their Hands and Seals, or the Hands and Seals of any two of them, to such Order or Orders, and shall cause the same to be delivered to the Person or Persons respectively entitled thereto, or to the Agent or Agents of such Person or Persons duly authorized, on such Receipts, Acquittances, or Affignments being delivered, duly executed, by such Person or Persons, to the Extent of the Money to be by such Person or Persons respectively

received, as the faid Commissioners, or any two of them, shall have directed or required.

XIII. And be it further enacted, That when and so soon as any Instalment or Instalments as aforesaid shall have been so paid into the Bank of England, the said Commissioners, or any two of them, shall cause Notice thereof to be published in The London Gazette, and so soon as they shall have ascertained any Dividend or Proportion of Money as aforesaid, they shall either cause special Notice thereof to be given to the Perfon or Persons entitled to receive the same, or to the known Agent or Agents of such Person or Persons respectively, of the Time when and Place where the Order or Orders for Payment will be delivered, or

cause Notice thereof to be published in The London Gazette, as they shall think proper.

XIV. And be it further enacted, That the Order of the faid Commissioners, or any two of them, shall at any Time be sufficient Authority to the Governor and Company of the Bank of England, for the Payment of any Money so paid into the Names of the Iaid Commissioners as aforesaid, in Manner directed by

And be it further enacted, That every Order made by the faid Commissioners, or any two of them, under this Act, shall be transferable by the Indorsement thereon, and Signature, attested by two credible Witnesses to such Indorsement of the Person or Persons to whom the same shall have been made and given by the faid Commissioners, or of the Person or Persons holding the same under any such Indorsement thereof as

aforesaid; and no such Order or Indorsement thereon shall be subject to any Stamp Duty.
