Mr. Doolittie enjoys certain rights and privileges under the Jay Treaty of 1794, which can be found in U.S. Immigration Law which states:

"Nothing in the subchapter (dealing with Immigration) shall be construed to affect the right of American Indians born in Canada to pass the borders of the U.S., but such rights shall extend only to those who posess at least 50% per centum of the American Indian Race."

Therefore, under the above mentioned statutes, Mr. Doolittle is entitled to live and work in the United States and enjoys dual citizenship as a citizen of North America.
