TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

Because of the lack of any Blood Quantum Content information in Federal Indian or Provincial Vital Statistics systems, it is difficult to establish an Indian's exact per centum of blood quantum.

The Registered Indian Record for the Six Nations of the Grand River Indian Reserve No. 40, shows the name of Benjamin [redacted] Doolittle registered under No. [redacted] Mohawk / Six Nations. His date of birth is shown as [redacted]

Benjamin's [redacted] Mohawk / Six Nations band, and his [redacted] Mohawk / Six Nations, [redacted] Mohawk / Six Nations [redacted]

Benjamin [redacted] Doolittle can be considered to possess 100 % Native Blood quantum.

Mr. Doolittle enjoys certain rights and privileges under the Jay Treaty of 1794, which can be found in U.S. Immigration Law which states:

"Nothing in the subchapter (dealing with Immigration) shall be construed to affect the right of American Indians born in Canada to pass the borders of the U.S., but such rights shall extend only to those who possess at least 50% per centum of the American Indian Race."

Therefore, under the above mentioned statutes, Mr. Doolittle is entitled to live and work in the United States and enjoys dual citizenship as a citizen of North America.
