

## Man (Ile of).

5. Treasury may purchase the *Ile of Man*, 12 *Geo.* 1. c. 28. § 25.
  6. Pension of one hundred Pounds a Year granted by *Charles* the Second to the poor Clergy of the *Ile of Man*, not chargeable with Taxes, 4 *Geo.* 3. c. 2. § 100.
  7. *Ile of Man* purchased of the Duke of *Atbol*, and vested in the Crown, 5 *Geo.* 3. c. 26.
